Consider This When Sponsoring a Volunteer Recognition Nomination

When originating a nomination, use these guidelines and the <u>Decision Tree</u> to identify the appropriate award, and ask yourself the following questions:

- · What other Volunteer Recognition Awards has my nominee received? Use this list as a starting point.
- Who else can support me in telling this story? Who has personal experiences that demonstrate my nominee's outstanding volunteerism? If your service unit has an Award coordinator, they can help!
- NOTE: If you're nominating for *Membership Tenure Numeral Guards* for 20+ years, or *Volunteer Service Awards* for 15+ years, you do not need to complete this nomination form. Instead, simply submit this <u>form</u> by email.

When *preparing* your nomination, consider the <u>criteria</u> for the award and ask yourself the following questions: How can I best tell the story of my nominee's volunteerism?

How did their service go beyond what is already expected for the position?

What are *specific* examples of things they've done, or actions they've demonstrated? Are there documented results achieved from these actions?

How do I collect data that will support my nomination? Who can help me gather any information I'm lacking? My Service Unit Manager? My Service Unit Awards Coordinator? A member of GSHNJ staff?

When writing your nomination or endorsement make sure it is:

Specific: fully describe the nominee's volunteerism and describe instances, actions, and results that illustrate how they have met or exceeded the criteria for this award. Remember that endorsements that refer to different types of service are far more influential than multiple iterations of the same instance of service.

Brief: state succinctly why you think this volunteer is a candidate for this award.

Clear: write simply so that reviewers easily understand the nominee's volunteerism activities.

How to be Specific When Telling Your Story

Not specific: In addition to leading a Brownie troop, Maria took over as Service Unit Cookie Manager when Sally resigned. It was a successful sale.

Specific: In addition to leading a Brownie troop, Maria took over as a Service Unit Cookie Manager when Sally resigned. Although she had not worked with cookies beyond her troop, she processed orders for 19,264 boxes of cookies with no errors. Through thoughtful troubleshooting and skillful management of her peers, Maria's dedication enabled our service unit to achieve 96% participation in the sale and increase our overall sales by 10%.

Not Specific: Monique is a dedicated leader and an inspiration to all of us.

Specific: When her daughter bridged to Cadettes, but didn't have a troop to enter, Monique formed a new troop that rapidly grew to 25 members. She enlisted the aid of several parents and assigned them each a role to help manage the troop's activities. They practiced inclusive behavior working as a "sister troop" to a troop whose members have developmental disabilities and invited them on their annual overnight at Camp Hoover. Retention for this troop has been 95% for the past two years. Monique is an inspiration to all of us.
